Jahanara Begum was a Mughal princess and the Padshah Begum of the Mughal Empire from 1631 to 1681. She was the eldest child of Emperor Shah Jahan and his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. Often referred to simply as Begum Sahib, she was the elder sister of the crown prince, Dara Shikoh, and Emperor Aurangzeb. The empire was founded by the Mongol leader Babur in 1526, when he defeated Ibrahim Lodi, the last of the Afghan Lodi Sultans at the First Battle of Panipat, where they used gunpowder for the first time in India.
